

Sukirtharani is a prominent Indian Dalit poet, recognized for her excellence in Tamil Literature.


The session strived to capture the essence of Dalit feminism by exploring Sukirtharani's poetry through a conversation with her.


Dr. Ravi Sriramachandran, Assistant Professor of Sociology and Anthropology at Ashoka University, acted as a translator for the event.





Avani Rai is a self-taught photographer and filmmaker based out of Mumbai, India..




