



INTRODUCTION:-

The report of the high level committee on socio-economic, health and educational status of tribal communities of India describes the tribal population in India represents an enormous diversity of ethnic groups. They vary among themselves in respect of physical features, language and linguistic traits, cultural variations, ecological settings in which they live, size of the population, the extent of acculturation, dominant modes of making a livelihood, level of development and social stratification. They are also spread over the length and breadth of the country though their geographical distribution is far from uniform. A majority of the Scheduled Tribe population is concentrated in the eastern, central and western belt covering the nine States of Odisha, Madhya Pradesh, Chhattisgarh, Jharkhand, Maharashtra, Gujarat, Rajasthan, Andhra Pradesh and West Bengal. About 12 per cent inhabit the North-eastern region, about five per cent in the Southern region and about three per cent in the Northern States. The distribution of tribal population is more in eastern, central, and western parts of the country. The major Indian tribes include Bhils, Gonds, Munda, Santhal, Garo, Khasi, Kodaba, Bhutia, Angami, Toto among others.

DEFINITION OF TRIBES:-

The Latin word tribes is the word from which it is derived. Common ancestors, descent, common dialect, are some of the important attributes to understand the group/community as a "Tribe". In Australia and Africa, these communities are mentioned as aborigines, and in America, they are referred to as Indians. But in India, "tribe" is in use since the colonial rule. Some of the popular definitions of tribe in Anthropology are:

- W.H. Rivers defined "tribe as a social group of simple kind, the members of which speak a common dialect, have a single government and act together for such common purposes as warfare" (Chaudhury, 1977).
