The Chhatrapati Shiveji Maharaj Vastu Sanghralaya or previously known Prince of Wales Museum of Western India. It has been declared a UNESCO world heritage site due to its architectural style is a mixture of Victorian gothic and art deco. George Wittei is the architect of the museum, it is asid that he took the eight arched pillars on the ground floor from the Vimal Vasahi temple of Rajasthan. The dome structure has been modeled from the Gol Gumbaz of Bijapur also inspired by the Taj Mahal.



The museum encompasses largely articles from the 6th-12th century on its ground floor which are from various parts of western India, majorly from Maharashtra, Gujarat, Karnataka, and Madhya Pradesh. The kingdoms that get a major highlight are the Cholas, Chalukyas, Pratiharas, and Bijapur. We see clear distinctions between the places that dominated shivaites and vaishnavites. In Gujarat, there were idols of different versions of Vishun and in Karnataka, there were idols of different versions of Vishun and in Karnataka, there were idols of different versions of shiva. Gujarat architecture used more pink sandstone whereas in Karnataka we can see more use of Basalt and dolerite.

The third floor of the museum is dedicated to galleries related to the Indian War of Independence of 1857, also known as the First War of Indian Independence. The galleries contain a vast collection of artifacts, including weapons, documents, and photographs, which help visitors understand the events of the war.

5. Basement: Ancient Sculptures and Artifacts

Apart from the above-mentioned floors, the museum also has a basement that houses a collection of ancient sculptures and artifacts from the Gandhara and Mathura schools of art.







Abstract

The beautification of the capital in company with its envisioning as 'global metropolis and world class city' has stamped out the deprived masses from there settlements. The trend set up by the colonizers to weed out and trickle the slums on the periphery can still be detected in the resettlement policies. The prospects of clean and green city need to be carried out keeping in view the interests of the main drivers of such a project, and not being callous to them. This article is an attempt to trace the major demolitions as well as relocations obliged to 'larger public interest as a failure of the policy administration under political influence'.

Introduction

'Slums' in the language of law refer to the clusters that are devoid of legal occupancy, and which are characterized by informal settlement layout along with paucity of basic amenities. A slang of "jhuggi-jhompri" (JJ) clusters gains currency to refer the blemished part of city, that breach the prerequisites of world class city. The highlights of relocation drives, drawing from the colonial mindset were in 1958-60, with the initiative of jhuggi-jhompri removal scheme (JJRS), followed by emergency period 1975-77, anti-Sikh riots 1984, the three-pronged strategy of 1990-92, and lastly during the commonwealth games of 2010 hosted in Delhi. There are however no watertight distinctions since many other resettlement drives have been conducted
