8) **“Climate Change and Disaster Management in the Eastern Himalaya” - A Guest Lecture by Prof. Vimal Khawas**



12) **Master's Fair**



13) Orientation Session on NEP with the Faculty of the Department of Sociology:



The discussion illuminated how media functions not merely as a mirror of society but as a potent actor in shaping discourse and access. The interactive nature of the session encouraged students to actively engage with the speaker, posing thoughtful questions and reflecting on their own experiences with media consumption and critique. Professor Jena's articulation of the "medium-message-meaning" triad offered participants a nuanced framework to analyse media in both academic and everyday contexts.

An international conference titled ***Exploring Hope and Gender Dynamics in South Asia*** was conducted in hybrid mode as a part of the department fest. The event welcomed distinguished speakers including Prof. Savyasaachi, Dr. Gopi Devdutt Tripathy, Dr. Leni Chaudhuri, Dr. Meeta Kumar, Prof. Reema Bhatia, Ms. Sumedha Priyadarshini, Ms. Parul Dubey and Prof. Sayema Haque Bidisha who engaged in a stimulating book discussion after the launch of the book - "***Gendered Transformative Initiatives in South Asia***" edited by Prof. Reema Bhatia.

A Paper Presentation Competition was conducted on the theme of Hope which attracted insightful student contributions. Dr. Meha Thakore, Dr. Shivam Chaurasia and Dr. M. Kamminthang were the judges for the event. A total of eight papers were selected to be presented at the competition from the vast pool of submissions received. The winning papers were as follows:


