Seminars/conferences/workshops conducted by the Department




The course was engaging, meaningful and thought provoking and elicited good response from the participants. The participants included students and teachers from different universities




epidemiologies, various physiological and biochemical mechanisms of our body, fighting cancer, etc. Participants-49

Students gained knowledge about rapid urbanization and its impact on the biodiversity and insights into


the science of restoration ecology.


