Research Projects:

Miles on Yamuna, under the Delhi University Innovation Project scheme. This project, undertaken in two phases, 2012-2013, and 2013-15, sought to investigate the socio-economic and political structure of communities on the banks of the Yamuna in Delhi, with a view to explaining the relation between the river and the city, and extrapolating from there sustainable solutions to keep the river alive.

My M.Phil. dissertation was entitled "The Indian Cotton Textile Industry in the Inter-War Period – A Study with Special Reference to Tariff Protection". I constructed and estimated a model of demand for textiles in the inter-war period to establish the effectiveness of tariff protection in British India, and examined the implications of the results in the context of the historiography and the political economy of the period.
