Trek To Nag Tibba: Date : 30.9.2022 - 3.10.2022

A trek To Nag Tibba was organised from September 30,2022 to October 3, 2022, the highest peak in the lesser Himalayas. A team of 26 students and six teachers scaled the peak at a height of over 3000 m. The team trekked from Panthwari village (50 km from Mussoorie) for five km to reach the Nag Tibba base camp. After an overnight stay in tents, a three km hike and steep ascent took them to the peak. The view of the greater Himalayas from the peak was spectacular. Finally, a hike of 8 km trek back to the base camp.




Experience Day of Nag Tibba Trek: Date : 15.11.2022

An Adventurous Walk to Shahjahan's Red Fort (Lal Quila): Date : 12.1.2023

The walk to Lal Qila was organised by adventure club of Miranda House on January 12,2023 at 10:00 a.m. There were 14 students and 2 teachers. We started our walk from Chandni chowk metro station. We were accompanied by Ruchi ma'am and Vijay sir. They guided us throughout the walk narrating the historicity of the places where we walked. We saw many shops which were 100 years old. Sir told us that Chandni chowk is also known as "moonlight square". It is one of the oldest and busiest markets in old Delhi which was designed by Shah Jahan's daughter Jahanara. At Lal Qila we saw Lahori Gate Chatta Chowk Bazaar (Covered Bazaar), Naqqar Khanah (Drum Room), Dault Khanah-i Khas-c-am (Public Audience Hall), Daulat Khanah-i Khas (Private Audience Hall), Diwan-e- aam, Hammam (Bathroom, Hayat Baksh Garden (Life-giving Garden), Mahtab Bagh Garden, Diwan-1- Amm (Public Audience Hall) is also known as Iwan-I Dawlal Khana-I Khass-o-Amm and Iwan-I Chihil Sutun (a 40 pillared hall), Jharokah-i-Darshan (an everyday practice of the King's appearance in public). After this knowledgeable and adventurous walk, we returned home. We developed greater insight about the historicity of Lal Qila from the walk.

The Adventure Club Society of our college organised a thrilling adventure camp at Miranda House itself. The event was aimed at promoting outdoor activities and enhancing physical and mental
