

## Events/Seminars/conferences/workshops/Extension Activities organized

• The Society's Orientation was organized for the academic session 2017-2018 in Heritage Hall on 9<sup>th</sup> August 2017. Students were introduced to the Gandhi Study Circle, MH and they also participated in various talent search programmes such as quiz on Gandhi and extempore competition.



- Fresher's Talent Search was held on 17<sup>th</sup>August 2017, and students participated in Quiz on Gandhi, debates and extempore were held for the Freshers.
- *Khadi Utsav* was organized by the society on 27th to 28th September'2017 in Students Activity Centre & Nescafé Lawns of Miranda House. On the first day, a *Charkha* Workshop by Seemaji was organized that was open to the students of Delhi University. Inter College Competitions such as Poetry writing and Action on *Hind Swaraj* were also conducted.

On the concluding day, i.e., on 28 September, the society invited Mr. Anna Malai, Director, Gandhi National Museum for a talk. It was then followed by a *Nukkad Nattak*, performed by the members of Gandhi Study Circle. Anna Malai showcased his appreciation towards the Performance by the gesture of invitation, as our volunteers received an invitation from him to perform the same *NukkadNatakk* at Gandhi National Museum on the celebration of Gandhi Jayanti. Furthermore, *Khadi* and some craft stalls were also put up at the Nescafé Lawns.



• On 2nd October, on the occasion of Gandhi Jayanti, students visited Gandhi National Museum, Rajghat. Like every year, a visit to Gandhi National Museum was organized along with the performance of *Nukkad Natakk* by the society volunteers.





- On 30<sup>th</sup>January, Gandhi Study Circle observed Martyr's Day by organising an Inter-Faith prayer meeting wherein bhajans were recited and visually impaired students read teachings on peace from different Holy Scriptures. While observing the Martyr's Day and after offering homage to the father of nation, silence was maintained.
- NSS in association with the Gandhi Study Circle, organised a mass cleanliness drive on account of Martyr's Day. A Personal Leadership Workshop by Teach for India was organised on 1.02.2017.NSS had volunteered for the Sanyukta Choudhary Memorial Lecture by Dr.Bindheshwar Pathak, sociologist, Founder of Sulabh International, an India-based social service organization which works to promote human rights and environmental sanitation.
- An interactive session with the renowned Gandhian Scholar, Dr. Suman Khanna Aggarwal was held on 31st Jan'18on the topic of "Understanding Gandhi Today". She interacted with the students of our society and it was very intriguing and interactive in true sense. Dr. Khanna then gave the Volunteers an invitation to her very active Gandhian NGO "Shanti Sahyog".





• On the annual college fest, Tempest, GSC conducted three major Competitions namely: Extempore, Representation of Gandhi through Art and Best Out of Waste. A large number of participants were witnessed. A talk by Prof. David Trabalouy was held on 9th March in Students Activity Centre, as part of the tempest.
