This session witnessed an array of additions to the already long list of the company's achievements.

JUO Sagarika Bose secured the second position in a quiz contest conducted during the Ek Bharat Shreshtha Bharat Camp from 19th July to 24th July and JUO Pragya Goswami participated in EBSB'21 Camp organised from 23rd August 2021 to 28th August 2021. On the same lines, SGT Drishti Garg represented MH NCC COY in the EBSB camp hosted from 25th September to 31st September 2021 by Delhi Directorate and pitched in by Kerala and Lakshadweep directorates as guests.

On 4th February 2022, on the occasion of World Cancer Day, MH NCC Coy joined hands with the Miranda House NSS unit to conduct a webinar on the subject of 'Closing the Gap'. Further, on 27th February, ten cadets, namely, CPL Neelam, CPL Nitesh, CPL Sakshi, L/CPL Sheetal, L/CPL Shruti, CDT Drishti, CDT Priya Yadav, CDT Priya Goswami, CDT Supriya and CDT Swati participated in a Polio Awareness Program organised under World Health Organisation by the Delhi Government.

Adding to the list, on 7th March 2022, a blood donation camp in collaboration with BloodConnect Foundation was organised. The event was a success and witnessed ample participation.

A Self-Defence workshop was conducted on 9th March in collaboration with NSS and Nirbhau Nari Suraksha foundation which witnessed a popular response and proved to be very helpful.

The session of 2021-22 was dotted with numerous events and workshops-both online and offline-that focused on all-round development and exposure for the cadets.

The seriality started with an inspiring webinar on 1st April 2021 on the occasion of AHWAAN'21 with Capt Dr Sunaina Singh, an ex-army officer, and a life coach, as the chief speaker.

On 7th and 8th April 2021, MH NCC COY organised its Annual NCC Fest, NISCHAY'21 virtually with the same splendid spirit and high josh. There were online participations for the Best Cadet Competition, Solo Dance Competition, Solo Song Contest and Poetry Competition, as well as enthralling webinars with Capt Dharamveer Singh and Maj Rudrashish Majumder.

In order to help the cadets and students deal with emotional stress during the pandemic, MH NCC COY organised a webinar on 3rd June 2021 on the topic "Emotional Regulation during the Pandemic" with guest speaker Ms Somya Narang.

Further, at the event of International Yoga Day, MH NCC Coy, the MH NSS Unit and the Department of Physical Education, Miranda house conducted a week-long certificate yoga course on 21st June 2021.

Also was organised an interesting webinar on the five-day method of the Service Selection Board (SSB), with a specific focus on personal interviews, ground tasks, and physiological factors by Ms Sammanika Rawat, the principal speaker.

Concluding their tenure on a bitter-sweet note, Karwaan was organised to bid farewell to the DL19s on 16th July 2021.
