On October 16, 2023, an enchanting Carnatic classical music violin recital was organized at the Miranda House Auditorium. The event featured the immensely talented Lal Gudi duo, GJR Krishnan and Vijaylakshmi Krishnan, accompanied by Sri MV Chandrashekhar on the mridangam.

The recital began with a captivating alapana, where the violinist explored various ragas, setting the mood for the evening. The first showcase included Varna (the vibrant raga) of Garudh Dhwani. Next, the artists played Rudra Pratam (Raga: Saraswati). The third Purandra Dasa, Raga: Narayana, is followed by Raga Kalyani, which helps in the improvisation of the tunes played. They played "Vaishnav Dhan toh Dene kahiye." This ended with the melodious and enchanting tunes of Sundari Bharaivi (a tune used in the Carnatic dance form performance Bharatnatyam).

The Carnatic classical music violin recital was a mesmerizing and soulful musical experience that showcased the rich heritage of Indian classical music.






RAAGMALA SERIES






'THE STALWARTS OF CINEMA' - CINEMA CLASSICS SERIES

SPICMACAY Miranda House Chapter organized a captivating cinema classics event, "Stalwarts of Cinema", featuring three iconic films - "Bicycle Thieves", "Rashomon", and "Jalsaghar" - on consecutive days (26th, 27th, and 28th February, 2024).

DAYI



Day I started with the screening of "Bicycle Thieves" accompanied with the presence of SPICMACAY's National Convener Rajiv Sir, the poignant narrative directed by Vittorio De Sica unfolded against the post-World War II backdrop, exploring the struggles of an impoverished father desperately searching for his stolen bicycle, crucial for his livelihood. The emotional resonance of the characters resonated with the audience, evoking empathy and reflection on societal disparities. The cinematography showcased the gritty reality of post-war Italy, enhancing the film's impact.

Post-screening discussions delved into the film's timeless themes, sparking conversations on poverty, morality, and the human condition. Attendees appreciated the choice of this neorealistic classic, acknowledging its enduring relevance. The event not only entertained but also stimulated intellectual engagement, reaffirming the society's commitment to promoting meaningful cinematic experiences.

DAY 2



Day 2 saw the screening of the first Japanese film to recieve international accolades: Kurosawa's classic film Rashomon. This film has several intertwining themes of poverty, the condition of women – and how different people have different perspectives about the same situation, now known as the 'Rashomon effect'. This shows how eyewitnesses can also be unreliable. The cinematography is crucial in the portrayal of the condition of people living at that time. The movie starts with despair in the forest scene where light rarely penetrates, depicting the darkness in which people were living, in a place where truth remains unraveled.

The audience discussed the themes of the movie as well as how sensitive issues such as the condition of women and how they were 'supposed to behave' was brought out. There was also a discussion on how poverty causes inhumanity, and simultaneously how there are some people who restore faith in humanity – as shown at the end of the movie.

DAY3



Day 3, the final day, wrapped up the series with the screening of Satyajit Ray's classic film - Jalsaghar. Based on Tarasankar Bandhopadhyay's short story, it deals with post-independence India and the abolition of the zamindari system by the government.

There is a twofold message that the film conveys, first the persona and type of the zamindars, with a certain way of life replete with customary etiquette, and dos and don'ts - including organising jalsas or celebrations of music and dance, even at the cost of family fortunes. And secondly, a depiction of the cultured patronage that the zamindars provided to the arts, so that they continued to flourish and develop with a high standard of aesthetics.

The audience participated in the discussion and took up these strands of the movie, of how 'the Jalsaghar' is the most important thing in the Zamindar's life and what he holds on to, even when everything else is gone.

VIRASAT 2024 SERIES

VIRASAT, a manifestation of culture, tradition and rituals, passed through generations to add substance of thought to their living. With this spirit, SPIC MACAY Miranda House Chapter celebrated their annual fest VIRASAT on 9, 12, 13, and 14th March 2024.

Heritage Walk (Purana Qila)

SPICMACAY Miranda House Chapter organised a heritage walk to Purana Qila as a part of its annual festival Virasat. The walk was led by Dr. Aradhna Sinha who guided the students through the history of the Qila.

The walk started at the Bada Darwaza, where Dr. Aradhna pointed out the details in the architecture of the gate including specific materials used and construction features of the arch. She also explained the history of important structures in the Qila such as the Qila-i-Kuhna Mosque, which was built by Sher Shah Suri. With 5 mihrabs, ornate jharokas, it is currently one of the better preserved monuments with ornate marble inlays, and calligraphic quotes from the Quran.

Then there is the Sher Mandal, which was used by Humayun as a personal observatory and is often known as Humayun's library. Humayun is said to have died while hurrying down the stairs when he heard the call for the evening prayers – namaz. There is also a Baoli in the Qila which gives us an insight into the effective water supply systems of the time. At the time of partition, Purana Qila was one of the biggest refugee camps housing several hundred men, women and children.

The attendees were riveted by the many facets of the Qila and its history, and asked several questions. A wonderful beginning to Virasat through a walk through a very significant of our architectural heritage.

Experienced a rich musical legacy with Bhuvanesh Komkali ji, the grandson of the legendary singer Pandit Kumar Gandharva and son of eminent vocalist Mukul Shivputra. Komkali Ji has received numerous awards, including the Mallikarjun Mansur Yuva Puraskaar from the Government of Karnataka in 2010 and Sangeet Natak Akademi's prestigious Ustad Bismillah Khan Yuva Puraskar in 2012.
