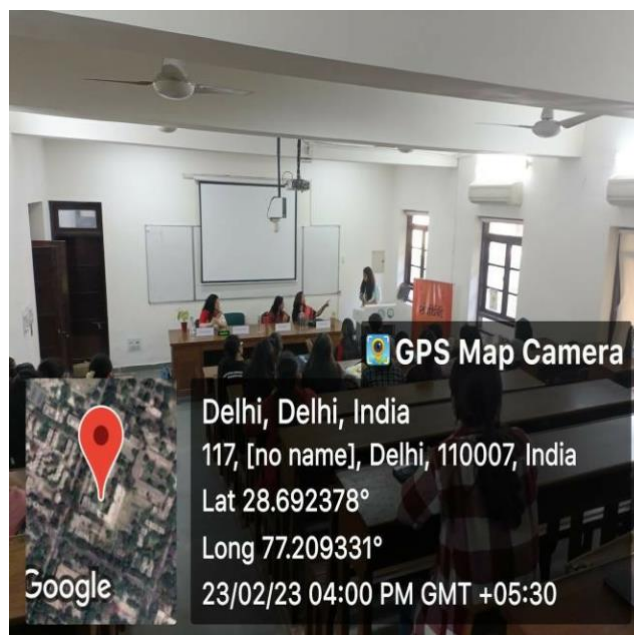
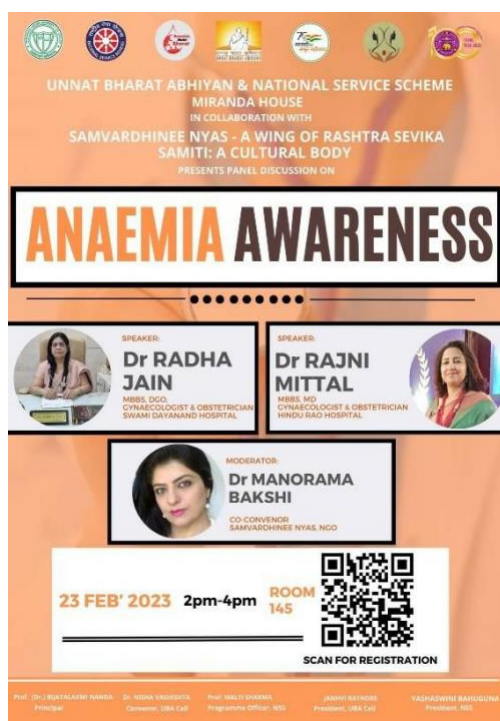
2. **Cleanliness Drive** in SKV Village, Jagatpur: a Nukkad Natak and a poster-making competition were organized on 1st February 2023, in order to make the students aware of the importance of cleanliness, waste management and plastic-related issues.

4. Panel Discussion on Anaemia Awareness: Unnat Bharat Abhiyan Cell and NSS Miranda House organised a Panel Discussion on Anaemia Awareness in collaboration with Samvardhinee Nyas. The speakers for the session were Dr Radha Jain, gynaecologist and obstetrician in Swami Dayanand Hospital and Dr Rajni Mittal, gynaecologist and obstetrician in Hindu Rao Hospital. The session gave the college students an insight on Anaemia, its effect on the female population in the country and precautions that can be taken. A free Anaemia testing unit was also set up in college by Samvardhinee Nyas.



5. IIT Delhi Expo: The UBA Cell team from Miranda house attended the Mahotsav and expo, UNNATI, which was organised in the Dogra Hall of IIT Delhi from 17th-18th March 2023. Prof VK Vijay, enlightened the students present there about when the Unnat Bharat scheme was launched and how it is working to bring peace between rural development and technological intervention.

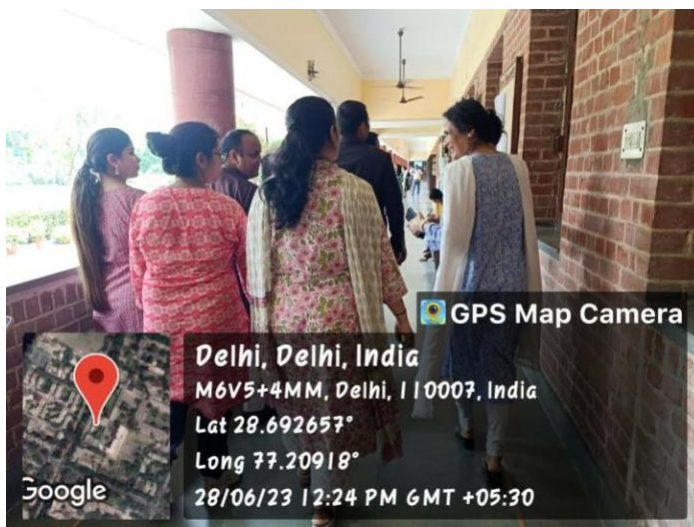


9. Session on Cow Dung Disposal Management in Jagatpur Village : On 5th of June, UBA in collaboration with NGO koshish conducted an awareness session on cow dung disposal management with the help of Mr. Vinod, a senior resident of Jagatpur Village in the supervision of Dr. Nisha Vashishta, convener of UBA and Dr. Bhupinder Kaur. The speakers of the session were Dr. Amit and Dr. Anil (CBG experts). Around 30 villagers participated in the session and told their problems. The UBA team also visited Anganwadis and National Health Mission Office of Jagatapur village and learnt about their working and common problems faced by them.
