
1.Celebration Of Universal Brotherhood Day: Commemorating Swami Vivekananda's Chicago Address




5. A Biopic Movie Screening on Swami Vivekananda

and enduring legacy.








6. An Extempore on Swami Vivekananda's Biopic



7. Speaker Session on "Access to Justice: An Imperative for Viksit Bharat"

Vivekananda Society, in collaboration with the Legal Aid Centre, Miranda House organised an enlightening session with Mr. Pawan Reley, Advocate on Record Supreme Court of India on 21st March, 2024. Mr. Reley is a distinguished legal expert, Advocate -on- record, Supreme Court of India, TEDx speaker and Atal Awardee (2023). The event was held at the Student Activity Centre and drew a diverse crowd of legal enthusiasts eager to hear from the acclaimed Advocate-on-record. The session commenced with the auspicious lighting of lamp by the guest speaker and faculty members.

The session aimed to delve into the challenges and opportunities surrounding equitable access to legal services. Mr. Reley began the session by recounting the story of a Prince to elucidate the concept of justice. He highlighted three key aspects: the significance of sharing resources, addressing the needs of every individual, and ensuring fairness based on merit. Through various anecdotes, including one about an elderly woman, Mr. Reley demonstrated how access to justice can be achieved by sharing his profound insights into the complexities of the justice system and emphasized the importance of empowering marginalized communities through legal aid and advocacy. Mr. Reley captivated the audience with his articulate explanation of the importance of Access to Justice, skilfully weaving in compelling narratives to resonate with attendees, many of whom lacked a legal background. Despite this, engagement remained high, evidenced by the steady flow of questions from the audience. Advocate Mr. Pawan Reley's expertise and the active participation of stakeholders underscored the importance of collective action in promoting a more inclusive and accessible legal system. The session provided a platform for various stakeholders to discuss strategies for enhancing access to justice for all individuals, regardless of socio-economic background.
