
Gumaan


Around 90 students participated in various

activities held as part of the two-days event.



















Girl Force: Unscripted and Unstoppable

11th October is marked as International Girl Child Day, declared an international observance day in 2012 by the United Nations.

In order to commemorate the day, Miranda House College in partnership with UNESCO, supported by SB Foundation has joined hands to celebrate the power of Girl Child and to rekindle the conversation around girls in the contemporary world. 'Girl Force: Unscripted Unstoppable' is an event aimed at giving them the opportunities to engage in discussions and creative spaces around the Girl Child. A two day event was held on 21-22 October 2019.


On 21st October 2019, WDC organised **SPECTACLE** in partnership with UNESCO and SB Foundation. The theme of the event was **Girl Force: Unscripted and Unstoppable**. It was an open event in which the participants presented various thought-provoking performances in the form of skits, jingles and poems.

On 22nd October 2019, an engaging discussion with eminent panellists, namely, Sanaya Nariman, Punya Salila Srivastava, K. Moses Chalai, Monica Kumar and Shilpi Marwaha.

Over 200 students participated in various activities held leading up to the two-days event and on 21st and 22nd October.







Prior to the main events on 21st and 22nd October, several competitions were organised by collaborating societies to popularise the event. Women's Development Cell in collaboration with Adwitya-Fine Arts Society, Celluloid-Film Society and Snapshots, Photography society worked towards the events held around the theme

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WDC organised a Creative Expression Competition, *Raise A Prose* and Poster Making Competition on 17th October, 2019.







One Billion Rising (OBR)

One Billion Rising is the biggest mass action to free women (cisgender, transgender, and those who hold fluid identities that are subject to gender-based violence) from sexual and physical violence.

WDC launched the One Billion Rising movement on 12th November 2019 with the book discussion on *The Apology by Eve Ensler*, an American feminist activist, author and an award-winning playwright. She was joined Kamla Bhasin, an Indian feminist activist, poet, author, and social activist and Anuja Gupta, the Founder and Executive Director of RAHI Foundation, India's first incest/child sexual abuse response organisation.

There were performances by Sonam Kalra, a multiple award-winning musician, using her music as a message and Navtej Singh Johar, a Bharatanatyam exponent, choreographer and yoga instructor.









This was followed by the launching of OBR, 2020 and Slam Poetry Recitation events on the theme 'The Unworded Trauma of Childhood'. The event was conducted in collaboration with Blue Quill, the creative writing club of Miranda House, OBR and Shabdita, the Hindi literary society to commemorate One Billion Rising.

The event was organised in the auditorium and witnessed over 280 participants.







Climate Change and Gender

As Climate Change became a major topic of discussion around the world, the Women's Development cell organised a talk on "Climate Change and Gender" by Professor Neera Agnimitra, Head, Department of Social Work, University of Delhi.

The lecture was held on 14 November 2019 in Room no. 101. Over 40 students participated in the event.





On 17th January 2020, Women's Development Cell in collaboration with the Department of BA Programme and MHQC also helped in organising the Town Hall, a platform for discussion on the Nirbhaya Case and Women Safety by AAJ TAK and India Today, where representatives from political parties such as BJP, Congress and Aam Aadmi Party spoke about their work, concerns and answered questions asked by students.

National Girl Child Day

Women's Development Cell along with Adwitiya, Fine Arts Society were part of **Celebration of National Girl Child Day** at The UNESCO HOUSE, New Delhi on 24th January 2020. The celebrations began with a tour of marketplace of projects and conceptions which was inaugurated by Eric Falt, Director of UNESCO, New Delhi, Yasmin Haque, UNICEF Representative in India and Cherian Thomas, CEO and National Director of WORLD VISION INDIA.

Keynote addresses were delivered by them along with Priya Malik, poet and storyteller, which was followed by a panel discussion moderated by Prof. Marmar Mukhopadhyay, Education Technology and Management Academy. The panel consisted of eminent speakers including Dr Bijaylaxmi Nanda, Acting Principal, Miranda House, Prof. N.V.Varghese, NIEPA, Mr. Amod Panth, Prayas JAC Society and Dr. Gulshan Sharma, International Chamber for Service Industry, who covered topics ranging from importance of education in economic empowerment of women, role of public-school system in enabling inclusivity, need for multilingualism in education and roles of corporate sector.

The event concluded with a nukkad natak on Domestic Violence on women and recitals of poetry by students of Miranda House.






Movie Screening: Hazaro Khwaishein Aise

Women Development Cell organised a movie screening of "Hazaroo Khwaishein Aise" on 30th Jan 2020. The same was followed by a discussion on the necessity of cinema as a medium of political expression with an effort to understand the concept of social order as a tool of exploitation. The impact of disruption of exploitative social order in a democracy was also brought up in the discussion.

The movie was screened in room no. 268 and saw around 65 participants.




Rape Culture- Normalisation of Sexual Assault and Harassment

Women Development Cell in collaboration with Shreedhan, an organisation working for Women's Rights, organised an interactive session on *Rape Culture: Normalisation of Sexual assault and Harrasment* on 20 February 2020.

The speaker exposed the students to the root cause of what forms rape 'culture' and issues like placing women's value in their bodies, which makes them extremely vulnerable to violence. Through various everyday examples, students were sensitised about how sexual objectification of women is the basis of rape culture, where women are expected to subscribe to the "good women code" and this very conditioning later breeds as a rapist. She also suggested 16 ways listed down by the United Nations to end rape culture in India and encouraged womxn to unlearn the "good women code". The session gave the students a platform to voice their opinions and ask questions that are often deemed to be too "bold" for women.



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International Working Women's Day

Every woman's success is an inspiration to another. They are the strongest when they cheer each other on. On the **occasion of International Working Women's Day**, Women's Development Cell, in collaboration with the Commission on the Status of Women, organised a street play based on the collection *Atyaachar Devi ki Leelayein* on 4th March 2020.

The play depicted the everyday lives of women and various forms of oppression and violence, from highly gendered familial life to street harassment, oppression at workplaces to denial of gender justice in communal spaces.

This was followed by thought provoking discussion with reference to women against existing inequalities. The event was conducted in Nescafe Lawns, was coordinated by a team of three teachers and saw 150 participants.
