UGC Sponsored National Seminar, Jan 24-25, 2017

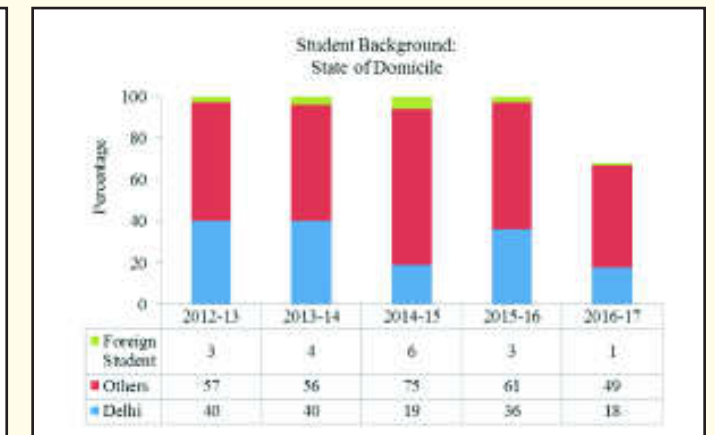
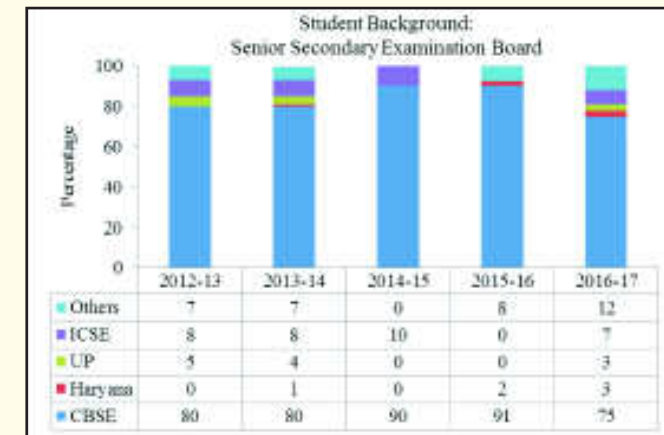
