Extension and Outreach activities

Miranda House encourages all students to participate in extension work, community engagement and outreach.

Policy Centre and Gender Lab (PCGL): The efforts of Policy Centre & Gender Lab (PCGL) are oriented towards generating awareness on gender issues and conducting research on policy and gender interconnections. The lab launched research infographics on "mental health challenges and mitigation". PCGL presents Myths and Facts on "International Day Of Girl Child" in a series Women And Poverty of five vibrant, informative posters on the various social media. Policy Centre and Gender Lab in partnership with Her-World and Curious For Law organised a webinar - How law protects women? The PCGL and Her-World India initiated a series of Saturday talks highlighting gender issues associated with health, education and other relevant matters.
