Miranda House Placement Cell had a very active and fruitful year. # **Extension and Outreach activities**

Miranda House encourages all students to participate in extension work, community engagement and outreach.

Clean Environment Drive: MH Vatavaran, the Environment Society, Miranda House like every year organized a Cleanliness Drive in collaboration with NSS, Miranda House to collect paper waste from the college campus and surrounding areas spread during campaigning for the Delhi University Students' Union (DUSU) elections. The Drive took place on 11 September 2018, one day before the DUSU elections. The Drive was a huge success, with an outpouring of woman power working towards a 'clean and green' campus. Around 100 student volunteers participated in the drive under the guidance of office bearers of MH Vatavaran and NSS. The collected paper waste was around 12 kg and was deposited at the College Paper Recycling Plant.
