It serves as the body in-charge of providing basic military training that instills a sense of comradeship, courage, honesty, and, above all, patriotism. The year 1917 marks the conceptualization of the NCC, and on July 15, 1948, it came into force with Governor General acceptance.

Miranda House has a robust and vibrant NCC programme with a total of 160 cadets, enrolled in the Army Wing.

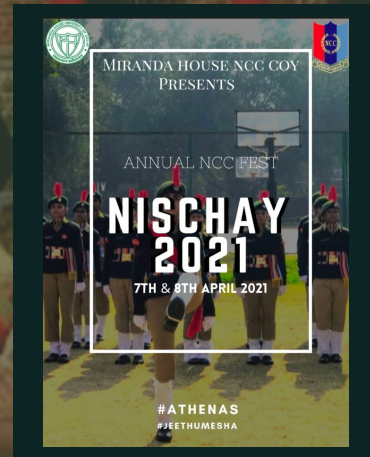
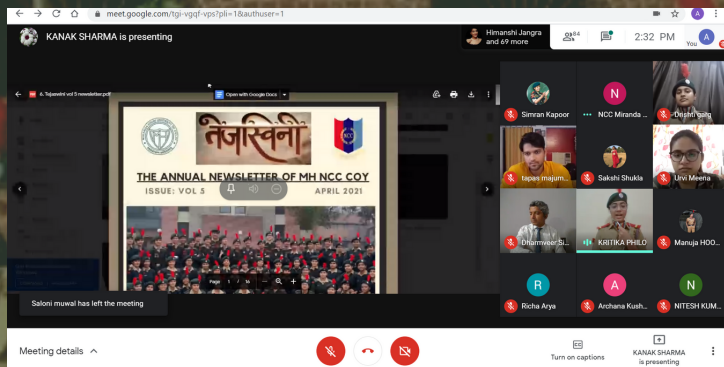
Miranda House NCC company proudly boasts the fact that some of its senior cadets have been commissioned as officers in the Armed Forces.

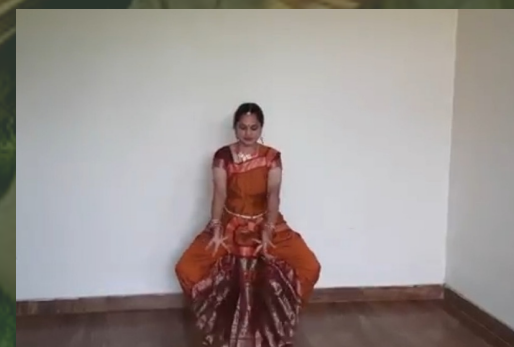
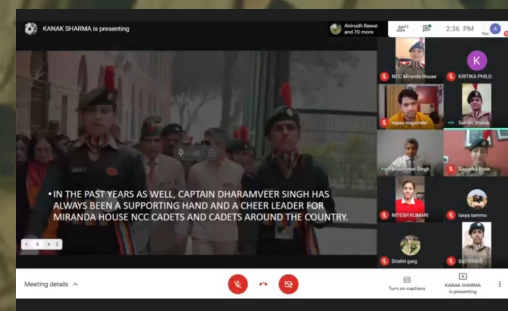
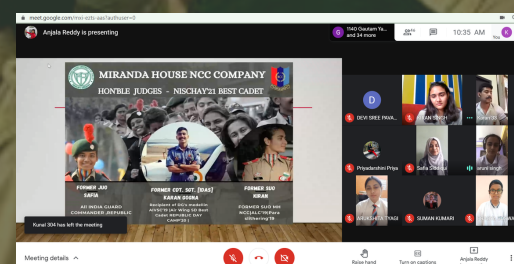
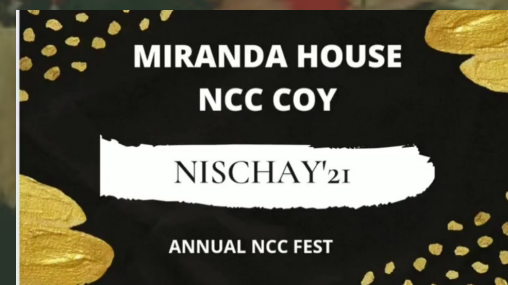


# NISCHAY'21

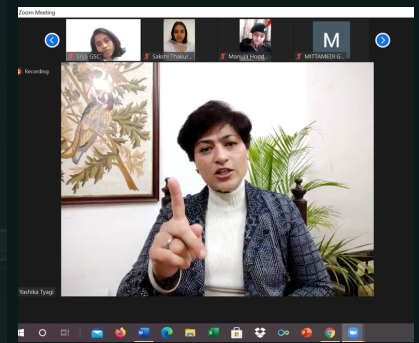




# TIMELINE OF EVENTS

Also on 8th April, during Nischay, Tejaswini - The Annual Newsletter of MH NCC was virtually released.

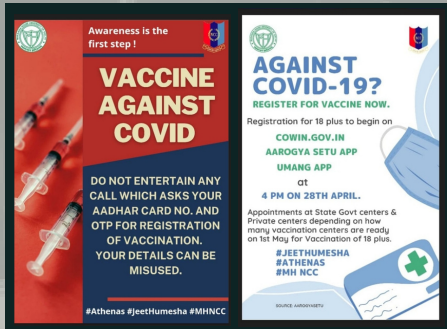

# MAY'21

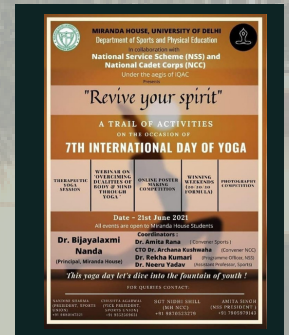

On 27th December 2021, on-ground physical tests were conducted for recruitment of new cadets.



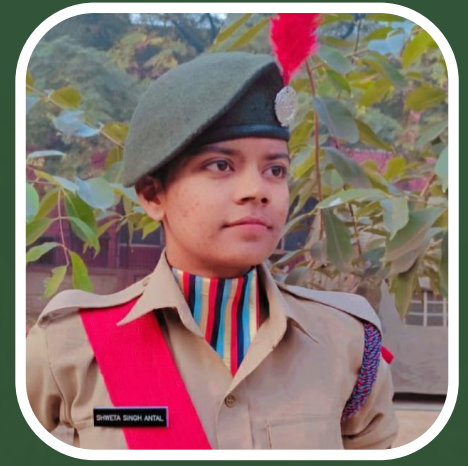

For any NCC cadet it's an honor to be a part of any prestigious National camp whether it is RDC, TSC, PM RALLY and more. Like every other cadet I wanted to be a part of Republic day camp and March on Rajpath.

Well, it all started in August 2021, I came to Delhi for the very first time because of NCC practices in college. Basic training was given by our seniors in college.

Then happened RD selections, which was the turning point.

There were 7 stages of selection procedures for RDC including pre RDC. With strong zeal, sheer determination and lots of hard work, I was able to make it to the final team of RDC, Rajpath, Delhi Directorate team. 
