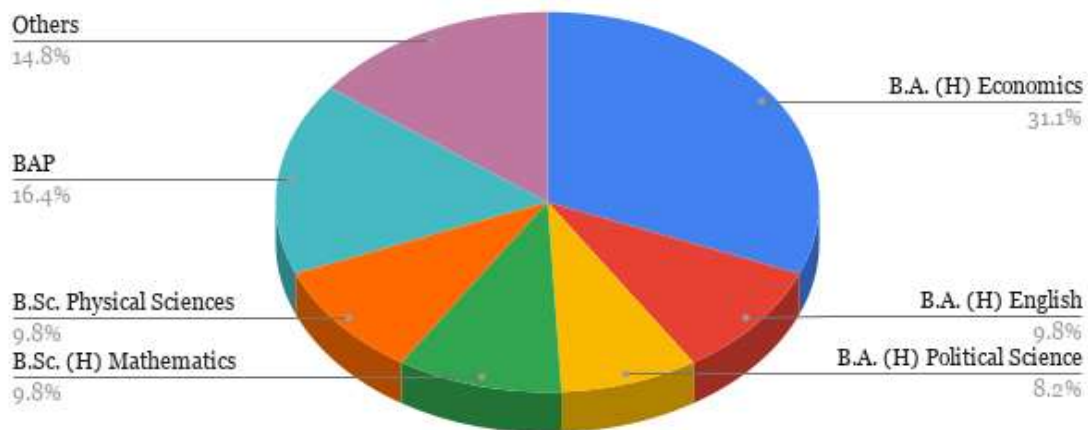
## ANNUAL REPORT 2025-26

# EVENTS AND INITIATIVES

## 1. Placement Cell Induction Program 2025

The Miranda House Placement Cell conducted its two-day Induction Program for the incoming batch of 2025 on 30th and 31st July 2025, with the objective of welcoming freshers and acquainting them with the diverse professional opportunities, resources, and career pathways available to them through MHPC and beyond.

The session began with a warm welcome and an introduction to the Placement Cell's vision, journey, and role as a bridge between Miranda House students and the professional

world of internships, placements, and skill development. Students were familiarized with the Cell's various initiatives, including resume-building workshops, mentorship sessions, competitive examination preparation support, and corporate readiness training. A detailed overview of MHPC's structure, core team, goals, and achievements highlighted its impactful work, including facilitating over 200 placement and internship opportunities in 2024–25 and achieving the highest package of ₹24 LPA. The induction also showcased *Chrysalis*, Miranda House's flagship annual offline job and internship fair, which has hosted over 40 reputed organisations such as Zomato, ABP Network, DeltaX, and Zieloch, drawing participation from more than 800 attendees.

An interactive segment on building a strong LinkedIn profile offered practical guidance to students, supported by inspiring examples from standout profiles such as Manya Rastogi and Vartika Rawat. Through engaging activities and relatable analogies, the program also emphasized the importance of balancing hard skills with soft skills for overall professional development. Students were further introduced to a wide range of career possibilities, covering traditional paths such as civil services, chartered accountancy, and teaching, alongside emerging domains like political consultancy, public policy with technology, climate economics, and digital campaigning, illustrated through contemporary examples including Shivam Shankar Singh. The event also featured an exciting Corporate Awareness Quiz, making learning about companies, sectors, and certifications both informative and enjoyable. The program concluded with an engaging Q&A session, where freshers enthusiastically raised thoughtful questions about internships, career exploration, and opportunities to contribute to the Placement Cell, making the induction a meaningful beginning to their academic and professional journey at Miranda House.



## 2. Webinar on ‘Opportunities to Study and Work Abroad’ in collaboration with StudyIn

To help students navigate higher studies from abroad The Placement Cell, Miranda House successfully conducted a webinar on “Opportunities to Study and Work Abroad” on 31st July 2025, in collaboration with StudyIn, a reputed overseas education consultancy.



The session was facilitated by Ms. Sandhya Kathuria, Branch Manager at StudyIn, who brings over 12 years of experience in the field of international education counselling. The webinar focused primarily on exploring higher education opportunities in the United Kingdom, while also providing valuable insights into academic and career prospects in countries such as the USA, Canada, Australia, New Zealand, Ireland, and Dubai. Ms. Kathuria addressed key areas such as application procedures, scholarship options, visa processes, and how to align one’s academic background with global career opportunities.

The session was designed to provide practical guidance to students looking to pursue education abroad, and was well-received by the participants.



## 3. PLACEMENT BRIEFING

The Placement Cell, Miranda House conducted its annual Placement Briefing for the Batch of 2026, aimed at familiarizing students with the upcoming recruitment cycle, policies, and expectations.

The session began with an overview of the recruitment timeline, A review of the placement record of 2024–25 showcased over 200 opportunities, with the highest package reaching ₹24 LPA and an average package of ₹9 LPA, reflecting the strong corporate engagement of the cell.

Students were also introduced to the Placement Portal and guided on resume formatting to ensure professionalism and uniformity. The placement process was elaborated upon, covering stages such as resume shortlisting, written tests, case studies, guesstimates, group discussions, and interviews. The four-year placement policy and tier system were explained, detailing the eligibility of both third- and fourth-year students, along with the criteria for movement across Tier II, Tier I, and Dream Tier companies. The code of conduct was emphasized, underscoring professionalism, punctuality, and discipline throughout the process, with a clear three-strike blacklisting system in place. The session concluded with a Q&A round, where student queries were addressed regarding company processes, eligibility, and preparation strategies. This briefing not only provided clarity but also motivated students to approach the placement season with preparedness and confidence.



#### 4. TEACH FOR INDIA MEETING

On 6th August 2025, the Placement Cell, Miranda House, held an official meeting with Ms. Ipshita from Teach For India to discuss upcoming recruitment and collaboration opportunities for the academic session 2025–26. The discussion focused on the Teach For India Fellowship, its application process, selection criteria, and the skills and qualities the organization looks for in potential candidates.

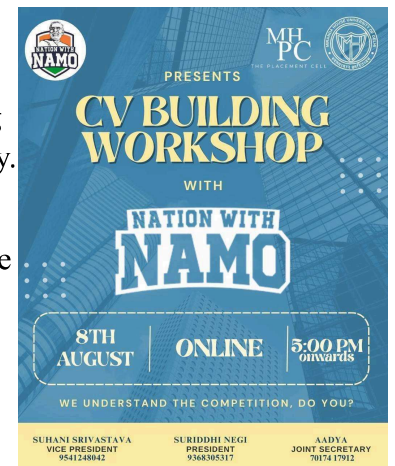

#### 5. Resume Building session with Nation with NamO

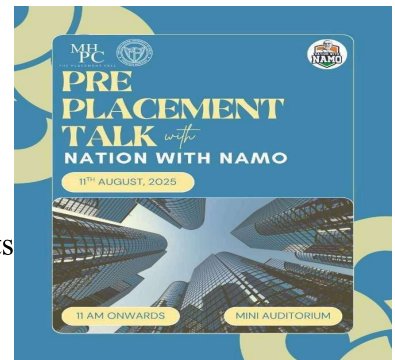

The speakers shared practical tips on tailoring resumes to different career paths, maintaining clarity and relevance, and avoiding common mistakes. The interactive workshop also allowed students to clarify doubts and engage with the resource persons directly. Notably, the resumes of 7–8 students were personally reviewed and analyzed by professionals, offering them valuable personalized feedback



#### 6. Nation with NamO PPT

On 12th August 2025, the Placement Cell, Miranda House organized a Pre-Placement Talk with Nation with NaMo, one of India’s leading political consultancy firms. The session provided students with an introduction to the organization’s vision, its role in shaping electoral strategy, and the evolving opportunities in political consulting. Representatives also detailed the roles offered through the Cell’s placement drive, which included Campaign Associate, Associate, and one Fellowship opportunity, thereby giving students clarity on the career tracks available. The talk was followed by an Aptitude Test, serving as the first stage of the recruitment process. The assessment tested students on areas such as logical reasoning, current affairs, and problem-solving skills, offering them valuable insight into corporate-style evaluation methods.

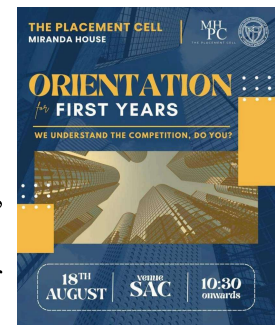

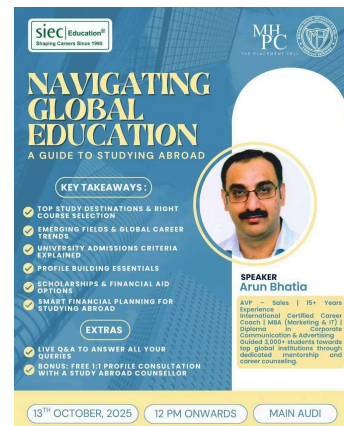

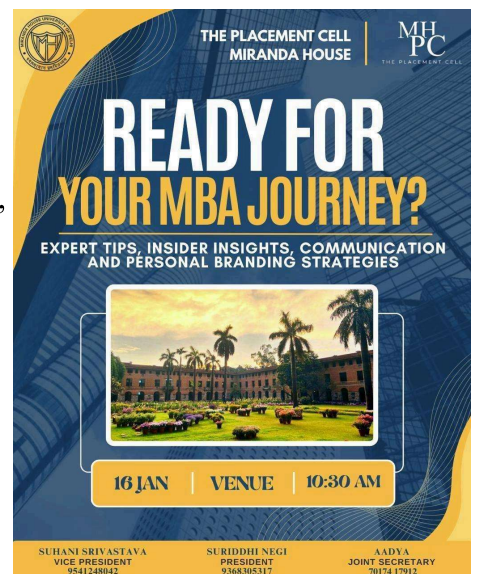

## 19. ICICI Bank Recruitment Drive

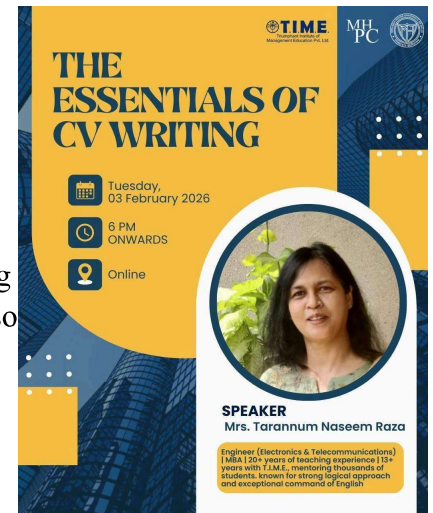
